
The Life of and Akathist to the Holy Great Martyr and Healer St. Panteleimon



The Life of St. Panteleimon, The Great Martyr and Unmercenary Physician

St. Panteleimon, the Great Martyr and all-merciful healer was beheaded about 305 A.D. during the violent persecution of Christians. The Church commemorates the Feast Day of St. Panteleimon on July 27. St. Panteleimon was born in the city of Nicomedia. At birth he was named Pantoleon, but before he was beheaded a voice from heaven named him Panteleimon which signifies, "all-merciful".

Panteleimon's mother was a Christian, but she died while he was very young His father was a pagan, and he taught his son to worship the Roman idols. St. Panteleimon was educated to be a physician. His teacher was a renowned physician and medical advisor to the emperor. Panteleimon frequently went with him to the palace.

Panteleimon became acquainted with Hermolaus, an aged, saintly, Christian priest. The priest explained and taught him the Holy Scriptures and the teachings of Jesus Christ. Panteleimon loved these lessons and in time he became inflamed with the love of God. Once when he was going home he saw a dead child lying on the road. A live venomous snake was lying next to the child. Panteleimon prayed to the Lord Jesus Christ and, the child came to life. After this miracle he was baptized by Hermolaus.

In time Panteleimon became a celebrated physician skilled in the art of healing. He gave of his service to all who called for physical and spiritual help. He healed and helped all without payment; hence, the Church titled him, "Unmercenary". Panteleimon was very sorrowful because his father remained a pagan, and he prayed to God that his father might become a

Christian. Once Panteleimon healed a blind man who in vain had doctored with all the healers in the city. When his father saw that the power of his healing came by the grace of God, he and the man who received his sight were instructed in the Christian law and were baptized.

Panteleimon's father was a wealthy man, and after death he left him a rich inheritance. Panteleimon distributed his wealth among the needy and unfortunate. He continued to help the sick. The Lord bestowed upon him the power to heal all diseases with His name. The sick flocked to him, and the people praised the unmercenary physician. The medical men became very jealous of Panteleimon. They reported his Christian acts of kindness and mercy to the emperor. He was forced to appear before the emperor and asked to renounce Christ and to offer sacrifices to the pagan gods.

Panteleimon fearlessly answered the emperor, "In truth I did renounce your false gods, and I offer glory to Christ for according to His works I have become convinced that He is true God. He raises the dead. He restores sight to the blind; to the infirm He gives strength and health." To prove to the emperor that the pagan gods were nothing, he asked that a sick person be brought in, and that the pagan priests pray for the return of his health. In vain did the priests pray to their false gods. Then Panteleimon prayed in the Name of the Lord, and the sick man was instantly healed. Many who witnessed the miracle believed in the Lord, but the idolatrous priests persuaded the emperor to seize Panteleimon.

After refusing to worship the idols Panteleimon was subjected to cruel tortures by the emperor. His body was torn by sharp instruments, and then the wounds were burned with a torch. Through all this torture he prayed, "Lord Jesus Christ, be near me and give me patience that I may bear this torture to the end". Next the emperor ordered the saint to be thrown into a vessel of hot lead; the martyr stayed alive and whole. After this a large

stone was tied to his neck and he was cast into the sea; he remained alive, saved from danger by the hand of God.

The martyr was then thrown into an arena with wild beasts, and he was asked to offer sacrifices to the false gods. He preferred to die rather than renounce the Lord. The wild beasts did not harm the martyr for once again the hand of God stayed the beasts. Next, the emperor tried new tortures. The saint was tied to a wheel covered with sharp spikes. When Panteleimon came through this torture alive, the emperor had Hermolaus brought before him. The emperor demanded that Hermolaus and his two associates, Erimina and Ermocrata persuade Panteleimon to turn to the pagan gods again. When they refused, the emperor had them flogged and then beheaded. The Church commemorates the death of these three martyrs on July 26.

Panteleimon who had been cast into prison was flogged and ordered to be slain. The martyr went to his death joyfully, chanting the Psalms. He was tied to an olive tree, but when the soldier let the blade down no harm came to the martyr-saint. The terrified soldiers beseeched the martyr to forgive and pray for them. It was at this time that a voice from heaven named the martyr Panteleimon. After praying, St. Panteleimon requested the soldiers to carry out their orders. Finally he was beheaded. The tree to which he was tied filled with fruit. Many who witnessed this became believers. The emperor commanded that the olive tree be cut down and the body of the saint be burned. Another miracle proved that the martyr was God's faithful servant — his body would not burn. Believers took his body and gave him a Christian burial.

After his death his relics were taken to Constantinople and kept there with great honor. There is a part of the relics of St. Panteleimon in a monastery on Mount Athos, which is called St. Panteleimon's Monastery.

St. Panteleimon is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers and is honored as the "Great Martyr and Wonder-Worker" and one of the unmercenaries who healed the sick without payment. After St. Luke, physicians honor St. Panteleimon with Saints Cosmos and Damian as their patron saint. All the healing powers of medicine are a gift of God Who is the Chief Physician, and Christians who are sick should first consider the health of the soul. The divine blessing is the Christian's hope, and believers throughout the ages have prayed that St. Panteleimon would intercede with God to heal diseases of the soul, body, and mind.

Service of Praise of the Akathist to The Holy Martyr and Healer Panteleimon

Kontakion 6

Priest: The blind man enlightened by you in body and soul became a preacher of the truth; for, like the blind man of the Gospel, he boldly preached Christ to all as the true light that enlightens every man. But for reproaching the impious emperor and the pagan gods, he was beheaded and rose to the unwaning light in heaven, to sing to God: Alleluia!

Priest: Standing before the emperor's tribunal with a radiant face you boldly declared in the hearing of all, thrice blessed martyr. All my healing power and glory is Christ, the true God, the Lord of all, Who raises the dead and heals all infirmities. For this confession we bless you and say:

Choir / Faithful: Rejoice, thundering mouth of the deity of Christ.

Rejoice, sweetly flowing tongue that declares His plan of salvation.

Priest: A luminous ray are you, O divinely wise martyr, to those sitting in the darkness of belief in many gods, leading them to the Sun of righteousness, Christ our God; pray to Him that we who offer you these

glad praises may ever live in the light of His commandments:

Choir / Faithful: Rejoice, bright star, shining in the spiritual firmament.

Rejoice, ray of light for Christian people.

Rejoice, you were mystically illumined by the Sun, Christ.
